Amy Geltz is the assistant coach for the girls varsity soccer team at Bishop Moore High School in Orlando, Florida. Prior to coaching at Bishop Moore, Amy was the assistant coach at Lake Highland Preparatory School for the girls' varsity soccer team for six years. During that time, the Lake Highland team competed in the State Championship Finals four times, winning the championship in 2006. Amy served as a physical education teacher at Central Florida Preparatory School (CFP) near Orlando, Florida from 2003 to 2008. Additionally, she joined FC America in 2006 to serve as an assistant coach for the club's Kumba U-15 Girls Premier Team.

Amy grew up in Orlando and graduated from Bishop Moore High School. While attending Bishop Moore, she set the national scoring record leading her soccer team to two state championships. She was also named an All-American and in 1994 was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame.

With such an impressive high school record, it's no surprise that Amy received a full athletic scholarship to the University of Central Florida (UCF) where she played mid-field and forward. While at UCF, Amy was named MVP Offensive Player and the Leading Goal Scorer. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Liberal Studies in 1996.

After graduating from UCF, Amy went on to play soccer nationally as a semi pro in Boston, Colorado, Florida and Maryland and internationally for the Norwegian Soccer Club, ROA, in Oslo, Norway. Over the years, she has coached a variety of club teams as well as at the college level for the University of South Florida in Tampa.
